PE & Sports News

We have had an amazing first term of PE across the school. Our focus has been our 'Personal' skills. From following instructions and good listening all the way up to challenging ourselves and learning to be resilient when things get tough.

Applying their personal skills and trying to improve their running times, KS2 have been timed to be able to enter our Cross Country event on 9th November. Over 120 children have qualified and will receive their letter at the start of next term.

We've had three very successful football tournaments at Sandown. We have hosted a total of 29 schools from the Hastings and Rother area accumulating over 280 fixtures of football! This has enabled nearly 60 children from KS2 to be able to represent the school already this term.

With the weather changing can I please remind you to ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for outdoor PE. E.g vest, joggers, hoodie, hat / gloves.

Attendance: Let's talk lateness!!

Poor punctuality is not acceptable! Late arriving pupils disrupt lessons and other children already working and can also cause embarrassment for your child.

The school day officially starts at <u>8:45 am</u> (gates are open from 8:30 - 8:45 am). Any child arriving after 8.45 am will be recorded as Late ('L' code used). Currently, the registers close at 9:15 am, and any child arriving after <u>9.10 am</u> will now receive a mark that shows them to be 'Unauthorised' late ('U' code used). This will not count as a present mark and will mean they have an unauthorised absence mark. Too many 'U codes' means that you face the possibility of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Let's work together to improve lateness!!
