PE & Sports News

This term in PE, we have been focusing on our social skills, working together as a team, taking turns fairly, and learning how to give helpful feedback and praise to our partners.

We are incredibly proud of the 13 children who qualified for the Area Finals Cross Country at Claverham, and even more delighted that seven of them have now made it through to the Sussex Finals in Crawley this March, an amazing achievement!

Our after-school football team also enjoyed a league fixture against All Saints. It was a brilliant opportunity for the children to gain match experience, and they came away with a fantastic 5–3 win, putting us at the top of the table.

This December, 60 children will take part in the Indoor Athletics event at Hastings Academy, competing in sprints and either a throw, jump, or agility activity, with results compared across local schools.

After Christmas, we look forward to chess, netball, and preparing for the Time to Dance festival at the White Rock Theatre. We'll also be learning about our *cognitive cog* in PE. As the weather cools, please remember extra layers, hats, and gloves for outdoor lessons.

Caretaker

It's that time of year again! The Christmas break gives the caretaking team the chance to undertake those minor maintenance works that can't be done while children are on site. Our dedicated cleaning team will also be undertaking the last deep clean of the calendar year.

With winter now upon us, caretaking staff need to keep a close watch on the weather bulletins. Frost and snow present us with some of the biggest problems in trying to ensure everyone is safe on the site, but we have salt spreaders and shovels to try and make this possible. The school will always attempt to open, even in what might seem to be severe weather conditions - but this is only if we can maintain safety throughout the day, if keyholders are able to get to the school to unlock, and if a sufficient number of staff are able to get to the school. Personal safety is our key priority.

If you wake up to snow, always check on Dojo to see if the school is open. It may, on very rare instances, be necessary to delay the start time to enable the site team to clear pathways. Have a happy and safe Christmas.
