Our mastery approach to the curriculum ensures literacy, including maths literacy, is at its heart. This is continually emphasised through:

## The Curriculum: Foundation Village

Our Foundation Village caters for our youngest pupils aged from 2 to 5 years old within the Nursery and Reception settings. Created in November 2017, it enables us to provide a nurturing environment for young children through their early developmental stages. Nursery children who are 3 and 4 have the opportunity, when ready, to enter the Sapling group in preparation for starting school. This phase is referred to as The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS).

During the Early Years Foundation Stage, there are seven areas of learning and development which are all important and inter-connected. Three areas are particularly crucial for igniting children's curiosity and enthusiasm for learning, and for building their capacity to learn, form relationships and thrive.

These three areas, the prime areas, are:

- Communication and language
- Physical development
- Personal, social and emotional development

In addition to these, there are four specific areas through which the three prime areas are strengthened and applied. The specific areas are:

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the world
- Expressive arts and design

At Sandown, we believe books are a great way to fire the imagination and use these to plan a balance of adult-led and child-initiated active, play-based experiences, with creative activities and challenges taking place both indoors and outdoors. Each text has been carefully chosen to ensure that children are getting a breadth of experiences



## The Curriculum: Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2

Key Stage 1 caters for pupils aged from 5 to 7 years old within the Year 1 and Year 2 classes whilst Key Stage 2 caters for pupils aged from 7 to 11 years old within the Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 classes.


During KS1 and KS2, pupils follow the National Curriculum for England:

At Sandown, topics have been designed around core books that capture, engage and enthuse our pupils. Each text has been carefully chosen to ensure progression is achieved across the school as well as providing a breadth of experiences across all subjects within the National Curriculum. Subjects are taught through guided and independent activities, games and challenges which take place both indoors and outside. Visitors and visits as well as local, national and cultural events are weaved into the curriculum to enrich our children's lives even more.



## The School Day







7.35am - 8.10am Our Sunrise Club is held in a designated building which allows parents to drop their children off before the beginning of the school day. For a nominal charge, they receive breakfast and enjoy a wide variety of activities before joining their classes at 8.30am.

8.15am The school gates open with KS2 children being able to take part in a multitude of sporting activities on the KS2 playground to promote health and well-being. KS1 children will need to be supervised by their parents whilst they await the start of the day.

8.30am – 8.45am Pupils arrive at school and are welcomed by their staff.

8.45am Pupil Registration

11.30am – 1.00pm Lunchtime

3.20pm End of the School Day

A choice of two course school meals, prepared on the premises, is available every day. Alternatively, parents may provide a healthy

3.20pm – 4.30pm A wide range of clubs are available both free and paid

3.20pm – 5.45pm Our Sunset Club takes place in our designated building which allows parents to pick their children up later than the end of the school day. Prices vary according to the length of the session they stay. Once again, there are a wide variety of activities from which the children can choose.

We are a dedicated team of professionals who work together to ensure all children can succeed. # **School Uniform**

## Communication

We place a great deal of importance on the partnership between home and school; therefore we have an open door policy where parents/carers are regularly invited to a wide variety of activities, such as parental engagement activities within classes, enjoying school performances, supporting P.T.A. events, joining us on visits, becoming school champions, sharing hobbies and skills, taking part in parent courses.

Staff are available at the beginning and end of the day to answer questions and share any shining moments. We have a Home School link book which is checked regularly. In addition to this we hold personalised consultations at least twice a year where we review the child's learning, behaviour and attendance, and after discussion, set new targets.
